

People, Get Ready Rev. Dr. Thomas Martin

One of my favorite Advent/ Christmas hymns is not in the hymnal or even commonly sung in churches. It is "People Get Ready," written by Curtis Mayfield and made famous first by the Impressionists. Rolling Stone ranks it as the 24th greatest song of all time. There are a lot of great versions of it, but Curtis Mayfield's is the best (send dissenting opinions to tmartin@ *fayettevillefirst.com*). It seems that this time of year, all we do is get ready. Some places have been getting ready since before Halloween decorations came down.

I'm not here to argue about timing of holiday decorations. I am here to persuade you that we, as Christians, are always getting ready for what's next. We are always getting ready for Christ. The season of Advent is designed for us to, as the Christmas hymn says, "Let every heart prepare him room." So yes, we are getting ready.

For the sake of argument, in the first of December, let's jump to December 26. What happens next? We've made our hearts and homes ready for the birth of Christ. What do we prepare for now? Well, I think that as United Methodists, as Christians, we are striving for perfection ("Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect." Matthew 5:48). We are tasked with making Christmas—the gift of Christ and eternal love every day. We are tasked with making Easter—God's triumph over sin and death—every day. That is a lot of work, more work than decorating and cooking and cleaning and shopping.

My hope is that we will get ready. We will get ready for what God



PRESCHOOLERS TALK CHRISTMAS Helping Children Learn | Kerry Bleil, Preschool

Most preschoolers LOVE to talk about pretty much anything. This time of year we hear their excitement about holiday happenings and celebrations: looking at Christmas lights, drinking hot chocolate while watching a Christmas special, or helping light the Advent candle in church. In preschool these real-life experiences provide age appropriate opportunities for children to connect speech with written language. Our two-year-old friends may create a classroom book with photographs of holiday traditions contributed by each family. Our three-year-olds may draw or paint pictures of an event they attended and dictate a few sentences about it to their teacher. To their drawings or paintings, our four-year-old students may write some words on their own. As children share these things with friends and family they are making sense of the world around them, learning that everything they say has value and that they are worth listening to.

So when a young child taps you on the leg and starts talking a mile a minute about how he helped pick out the perfect Christmas tree, take a moment to truly listen to what he has to say. Let him practice speaking about something he is excited about. You will be helping the children of today become the well-spoken and well-written adults of tomorrow. And you just may catch a bit of their joy!
