
WORSHIP AT FAYETTEVILLE FIRST UMC

PLAYING FOR OUR FUTURE

Helping Children Learn I Kerry Bleil, Preschool

When you think of preschool, many images may come to mind. Along with paint, puzzles, and blocks you may envision children learning how to be a good friend, how to control impulses, and how to be a problem solver. You wouldn't be wrong. Helping children gain these "soft skills" is a huge part of what we do in preschool.

Notice I didn't say that we teach these things. We give the children the opportunity to practice these skills in real-life situations. We let them learn how to negotiate, communicate, and collaborate when they play "house" together. When they choose to create something at the art table, they are having to make decisions, plan, and organize. And when they comfort a friend that is upset, they practice problem-solving and exhibit compassion. Play is VERY powerful! So if your images of preschool involve only alphabet flashcards and rote counting, I urge you to consider the power of play. If we allow our children to play today, they will be successful in all areas of their future!


