The month of February is very significant in many ways. Within the context of education, our children learn about Black History in schools. Within the context of the church, we mark the beginning of Lent with Ash Wednesday. Within the context of the world, we celebrate Valentine's Day.

What I often gloss over and forget is that it is *St. Valentine*'s day, marking one saint of the church (Valentinus) who was sainted because of his work with persecuted Christians in the 3rd and 4th centuries. He would perform weddings of Christians so that husbands would not have to go serve the emperor (married men did not have to serve the empire, but marriages were outlawed for a time).

He was persecuted and put in jail, but his ministry continued

to fellow believers. The legend goes that he was writing letters to those Christians who were to be put to death because of their belief in Jesus Christ as the savior rather than the Roman emperor. He would often sign his letter from his own prison chambers to others, "Love, Your Valentine."

Whatever the month of February may mean to you, I hope you will take a moment to pause between the chocolate, cards, flowers, memories of loved ones gone, and memories of loved ones present to remember that we share love. Not just love because of people like St. Valentine, but because of the love that God has for us. May we all share that hope for the world.

FFUMC'S FISCAL YEAR 2019 IN REVIEW

As we enter 2020 it is appropriate to review how FFUMC finished the previous fiscal year. In 2019, both actual revenue (income) and expenses were approximately 94% of the budgeted amount, and expenses exceeded revenue by nearly \$20,000 (1.35% of our 2019 budget). The difference between expenses and revenue is shown as only \$6,209 because approximately \$14,000 was transferred from reserves in 2019 to assist with cash flow at key points during the year.

For comparison, 2018 year-end revenue and expenses were \$1,468,331 and \$1,497,942 respectively. Below are other take-aways from the 2019 fiscal year:

- Conference Apportionments were paid at 100% of the budgeted amount, totaling \$139,225.
- Staff expenses (salary and benefits) are the largest budgeted account. The actual expenses for staff in 2019 were \$840,643.
- The Ministries account (includes Discipleship, Missions, Worship, Music, Children, Youth, Adults and other subcategories) had \$86,222 in expenses. The Ministries account had a 2019 budget of \$106,075.
- The Property account includes Utilities, Insurance, Facility Maintenance, Vehicles and Supplies, and it had \$263,031 in expenses. The Property account had a 2019 budget of \$289,550.

The Church enters 2020 with \$88,450 in cash reserves and over \$900,000 in total current assets (excluding fixed assets). We also enter 2020 with a budget guided by faith that revenue will equal or exceed what we had in 2019. The Holy Spirit is working in many ways throughout our Church and we are all responsible to support these efforts through our time, resources, prayer, hope, faith and love! As Peter instructs us:

"Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock." 1 Peter 5:2-3

The Finance Committee will provide updates on revenue and expenses throughout 2020.

How did you get involved? As a new person to the community I had been prayerfully seeking ways to be in ministry through this church, just as I was in my previous one. Then as if an answer to that prayer Phyllis Williamson invited me to Titus II and also asked me to join the flower ministry team. I told her, "I can't arrange flowers!" She let me know that wasn't necessary: just willingness to deliver and visit with people.

What do you love about this ministry? Having been in volunteer hospice ministry for twenty five years, I had been missing that one-on-one connection with people. I do find such pure joy in that time with others. One of the things I love about this ministry is renewing old friendships from when I lived here before and going to places where I meet new people, sitting with them and simply loving on them!

How has it impacted your faith? I see Jesus in others as well as being able to be his feet and hands.

What might someone want to know who is considering this ministry? People might want to know that we usually go in pairs. That might be a help to someone who doesn't want to go on their own.

STAYING INFORMED ABOUT GENERAL CONFERENCE

Forward Together I Rev. Dr. Thomas Martin



As we draw closer to The General Conference of the United Methodist Church, May 5-15, a lot of attention has been given to recent press releases of a protocol put forth by a very diverse group of United Methodist leaders. I am still piecing together the information and interpreting it as it comes out. I do, however, want to share with you the information we receive as pastors so that you are aware of what is going on.

Here are points of information from the Cabinet of North Georgia that were shared with Clergy:

- The participants in the mediation represent centrist, progressive, and traditionalist perspectives, and come from the United States, Africa, Europe, and the Philippines. These leaders came to unanimous agreement on the Protocol.
- This Protocol offers a path for The United Methodist Church to continue to be a denomination for those with traditional, centrist, and progressive perspectives. The post-separation United Methodist Church will continue to have room for divergent perspectives and value diversity as an essential component of our faith.
- The Protocol also offers a path to separate for those whose convictions do not allow them to continue to be United Methodist.
- The mediation participants are now developing legislation that mirrors the Protocol. This legislation will be considered in May by the 2020 General Conference. It is expected that this legislation will be considered ahead of all other legislation.
- What we hold in common, above all else, is our call to reach those who do not yet know Christ's love.

In addition, we have helpful links at *fayettevillefirst.com* that I hope you will continue to resource and reference including The Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace Through Separation, Video: Panel Interview of Participants in the Mediation Process, FAQs, and Podcast: At The Table With Bishop Sue - Episode 3.

As I referenced in the letter I addressed to our congregation here at Fayetteville First UMC, let us commit ourselves to doing these four things:

- 1. Pray. Pray for the church and pray for our church.
- **2. Read** the information from the sources above as level-headed and rationally as possible. Then re-read them. As you **seek out** other information, ask yourself these questions: Who is the author? Who is the audience? Am I reading this to confirm my bias or suspicion or am I reading this with charity and love?
- **3. Be present** in worship with us as we make our priority sharing the light of Christ through Fayetteville First UMC. When we worship together, we do not worship ourselves, but we worship in order to give glory to God.
- **4. Reach out** to me to find a time to talk if you have questions. I am receiving this information on the same timeline as you and am dealing with the implications and emotions of what this entails while also sharing ministry with you at this wonderful congregation of the United Methodist Church. We will create space and time to talk through what this all means together.
