We begin to *be* the church.

We are the church when we fully

We do not come to church to only get something out of life; we come to church to make more of this life than we could on our own. We do so with God's help.

In worship during the season of Lent, we will look at the spiritual disciplines that we affirm whenever a member is baptized into or joins the life of the church. When someone does this, we renew our commitment to uphold the church, Fayetteville First UMC, with our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.

I hope you will think through what it means as we follow the disciplines—the work—of being a disciple throughout this holy season of Lent.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE NOW

FFUMC Capital Campaign

When our capital campaign began late in 2018, the goal was \$350,000. This goal had three parts:

- to provide a dedicated youth space (\$160,000)
- to refurbish the fellowship hall and create a usable space outside the fellowship hall (\$140,000)
- to add funds to the trustee reserve account (\$50,000).

The funds were quickly raised for the youth space, The Foundry, which has been in use by our youth since last year. \$156,104.11 was the final cost, which was slightly under budget.

The trustees are in the process of seeking bids for lighting, flooring, and painting of the fellowship hall. Plans are also being developed for audio visual equipment and upgrades to the folding walls and kitchen. Just under \$44,000 is needed to meet our initial goal for the project; however, the total amount needed may require adjustments.


