

Wisdom in our worrying

In Luke's gospel, chapter 12 verse 25, Jesus says, "And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?" I wonder if Jesus was around today, what would he say?

Probably the same thing, to be honest. It may not seem like it, but the words for us fit. I've been pondering this verse for a while, using it as a prayer for myself when I wake up, at night, during the day, as we're looking at decisions for our children and school and those that are making the decisions for all students in our county and area. "How can you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?"



What has been interesting to do is a deep dive into this particular verse. Most English translations of this text maintain some sense of time span and life. However, the most accurate reading is "can any of you by worrying add a cubit to your stature." The difference is measurement of time versus measurement of stature.

How many people worry about the present circumstance *in order* to be right? It seems that if we worry *in order* to be right, then we are seeking to add cubits to our stature—we are seeking to make more of ourselves than we are.

We all have things to worry about these days. It seems impossible to take Jesus' words seriously sometimes. But we must remember that there are things worth worrying about. If we worry, let us do so in an attempt to be more gracious, more loving, more hopeful, and more helpful to those that may be carrying more worry than others. May God give us the wisdom to worry about that which matters most to God—the people of God.
