The Season is upon us

I know Christmas is not yet here. I know we have not yet gone through the Thanksgiving holiday. However, I want to make you aware of how we are going to be celebrating the Season of the Nativity here at Fayetteville First UMC. The Season of the Nativity begins in Advent and ends on Epiphany Sunday. Epiphany Sunday is the day of light where we celebrate the complete Revelation of Jesus Christ as a baby, celebrating it with the arrival of the Three Kings.

The Season of the Nativity is an important season because it helps us prepare for Christmas, celebrate the birth of Christ, and ushers us out into the world once the decorations begin to come down in our homes. This year, we are obviously wanting to be together in fullness of worship. However, we know that for many, caution is still a priority when it comes to social distancing and gatherings. Because we want to find ways to celebrate together, we have put together packets for the Season. In the packets we have a "make your own" Advent wreath with candles, prayers for each week of Advent, an intentional daily calendar with prompts for spiritual guidance, a "do it yourself" nativity scene, as well as a special ornament. You'll also find a book of devotions from our youth and a calendar.

It is our way of trying to stay connected during these days. It is a way that even though we are physically apart, we do not have to be spiritually separated. I am grateful to those who have contributed to make this happen so that everyone can participate. Our goal is for everyone to have one starting the first Sunday in Advent (November 29th) and to let these spiritual practices help you during this season as we draw closer to the nativity and the light of Christ draws closer to us.

Fayette Samaritans Food Pantry Needs



Donations needed for families


