Driving around in circles

On Wednesday, I willingly drove around in a circle around downtown. The goal was to see how close to a 5k it was driving around downtown area for the upcoming COUCH to 5K. If you make two circles from Jeff Davis on the eastern side to the loop on the western side that says, "Welcome to Fayetteville" it is 3.1 miles. Driving around in circles got me thinking about what it means to turn around.

In our Christian lives, we turn around a lot. Only we call it *repentance*. Repentance is the process of turning from one action to another. It is not a full rotation to end up back where we were, going the same direction. Rather, it is turning around and going in a different direction.

Specifically, we repent when we turn away from sin and embrace God's love for us through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In our United Methodist tradition, we do not see this as a one time event. It is a process of continual renewal and regeneration. It is something that we have to do to turn away from sin. While it is necessary to embrace God's love in our lives, it is not an isolated event. Repentance is always a necessity and within reach.

The early church (and in reality all of Christianity) believed in and practiced repentance. It became part of their worship. It became part of their identity. It became part of us.

How often do we take the time to repent? How often do we take the time to turn around or turn away? I suspect that we could all use a little bit more repentance in our lives.

Jesus calls us to repentance. In Acts, Peter calls his hearers to repentance. Who is calling you to repentance today? Where will you hear the voice of repentance? I would like to invite you to worship with us in person or on-line this Sunday as we hear the invitation to repent and to become more like Jesus Christ.


Children enjoy Bible Story Time for Kids on Sundays at 10 a.m.

Just call the church office by Wednesday at noon to reserve a place during Bible Story Time or the 11 a.m. worship service (770-461-4313).






