Were you there when they crucified my Lord? Were you there when they crucified my Lord? Oh, sometimes, it causes me to tremble, tremble. Were you there when they crucified my Lord?

Often times, I get caught up in the throes of Easter and preparation that I miss the impact of Good Friday. That spiritual hymn "Were You There?" never answers the question directly. "Were you there?" If you read the story of the trial, denial, and crucifixion, the most direct and honest and unimaginative answer to that question is no. We were not there. We weren't present at the Passion of Christ.



However, if we use our theological imaginations, we can certainly see ourselves there as friends and family weeping. Do we also acknowledge that we would have been caught up in the crowds screaming, "Crucify him"? Do we also see ourselves in the crowds shouting on the street as Jesus passes by? Do we also admit to our own egos which think that we know better? Do we take time to realize that our sins, not the sins of others, are the reason that Jesus is there?

I hope so. I also hope we realize that it is because of love that Jesus is there. In the darkness of this Good Friday, let us realize that it is love that led Christ to Jerusalem. It was love for the whole world that Jesus came.

"Were you there when they nailed him to the tree?" We were there. "Were you there when the sun refused to shine?" We were there. "Where you there when they laid him in the tomb?" We were there.

"Sometimes, it causes me to tremble." May we tremble in our wonder and amazement as we encounter Christ's love for us on this Good Friday so that we may rejoice on Easter. May we be there with Christ because Christ's presence is always here with us.


