There are seasons in the life of the church. There are cycles. There is change. But there is God's constant love that abides with us and leads us into new ways of living. We are in the Easter season. The Easter season lasts fifty days beyond Easter. It includes Sundays in which we are invited to remember Christ's life, resurrected and real. It is an invitation for us to become like Christ.

Only 30 campers admitted so sign up early!


