The seed of change

The afternoon thunderstorms (with the 50/50 chance of rain which means that it will rain suddenly—you just don't know when or how hard) have been great for the plants in our yard. But it's meant that we've been inside most of the afternoons and evenings. Plus, I'll admit, I don't really want to go outside in the aftermath that is that humidity.



In a sense, we are a mess.

That's ok. God is in the business of messes and chaos. Remember in the beginning when God spoke into the chaos and created earth and land, day and night? God does some of the best work in the chaos and dirt of life.

We are surrounded by dirt. But there is something that goes into dirt that transforms the dirt, uses the dirt, and changes the whole area around that dirt. It is a seed. As Jesus reminds us in John's gospel, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it will only be a single grain. But if it dies it bears much fruit" (John 12:24).

Christ is the seed that changes the whole earth. Christ is the seed that has died and bears much fruit in our lives, pushing and prodding through the dirt and chaos of what goes on underneath the surface and changes the whole landscape. It is Christ who is the seed and that is what the Kingdom of God is like. When we participate in the Kingdom of God, we see past the chaos and we live through the chaos. When we emerge, we come out changed, ready to change the world around us to be more like God and less like us. May it be so in our lives, in our church, and in our world.


