#### **Question Everything**

Revolutionaries, skeptics, doubters, believers--all are told to question everything. It is something that allows room for critical thinking. It allows space for us to hear and receive information, but also know that not everything we read on the internet is true. **Question everything** is great advice when applied to receiving information and what we do with that information. But how often do you question everything about yourself and your motives? Do you question everything because you want to be right or because you want to be loving?



I know that I have done damage for the witness of Christ when I spend more time trying to be right. I know that in the past my pursuit of being right means that I was not spending the emotional energy on my family, relationships, and seeking understanding of what it means to be like Christ. When I spend more time trying to be right, I am ultimately trying to win. I am trying to "not lose."

In Matthew 16:25 Jesus says, "For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it."

If my quest for being right is erroneously about not losing, but Jesus tells us to lose our lives for his sake, then maybe the goal of day-to-day living is not to be right. Our priority as people of the cross is not to spend our time trying to be right. In being right, we run the risk of missing out on loving others.

1 John 4:19-20 tells us, "We love because he first loved us. Those who say, 'I love God,' and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen."

Question everything. But first, always first, question yourself. Maybe begin with this question, "Is my desire to be right greater than my desire to be loving?"

Donation Opportunity: The Jail Ministry of our Church has received a request from Deputy John Govaerts, Chaplain, Fayette County Sheriff's Office for donations of books to be used in the jail.

The books must be paperback/soft covers with no metal or staples in the binding. Subject matter can be varied. Religious and inspirational as well as all types of subject matter; novels, mysteries, biographies, history, fiction and nonfiction, sci-fi, series, how to guides, self-help, etc. The Chaplain will be sure they are appropriate before they are loaned out on the library carts.

The Jail Ministry has not been able to meet for over a year due to Covid restrictions, however, we are planning for it to reconvene soon. Here's how you can be prepared to serve:

The Jail Ministry can always use volunteers, men and women. The application process is easy and there is a training meeting to attend. The next training class will be held on July 8 at our church. Your application must be submitted before attending the class. (Contact Jo or Danny about applying.)

As a volunteer you might give an hour once a week to visit and minister to the inmates. You do not need to be a Bible scholar or clergy to make a difference in the life of someone. Sometimes they need someone to listen and encourage them and to show that someone cares and will be praying for them.

You may be thinking, "Maybe God can use me despite the fact that I am ill suited for the work." Sometimes the fact that there is nothing about you that makes you the right person to do something is exactly what God is looking for.





















#### Dear Friends,



#### What's Happening Fiscally at FFUMC?



Did you know there are many ways to give to Fayetteville First United Methodist Church?

- Cash and checks can be given to the Church during Church services. These gifts are collected by members of the Finance committee and deposited in a safety deposit box for processing on the next business day.
- Checks can be mailed or taken to the Church Office (175 E. Lanier Avenue, Fayetteville, GA 30214).
- On-line payments using a credit card, debit card, or electronic fund transfer (EFT) can be made using Realm. Access Realm at https://onrealm.org and go to "Giving." If you need a Realm sign-in or have questions, simply contact the Church Office at 770-461-4313 and someone will assist you. With a Realm sign-in, you can see your pledge for 2020, review gifts already made, manage future payments, or schedule new gifts.

Some people prefer the intentional act of giving during a Church service. It is a time and act that can be directed toward God. Others prefer the convenience and reliability associated with scheduled gifts. Chose the method that works best for you.
