One thing I have noticed from last summer to this is the question, "Are you going anywhere this summer?" has shifted to "Where are you going this summer?" There is an importance for many people in getting away, in taking time off, in breaking from the routine of life.



I once heard a retired Bishop say that when he was a pastor, he

asked his congregation if they got a chance to get away that week. He knew that they weren't in any position to take vacations on a weekly basis. However, he did understand the need to get away. He would even encourage his congregants to simply close their eyes for about thirty seconds, just to take a break.

In Mark's Gospel, chapter six, Jesus encourages his disciples to take some time to get away. They were invited to get away from the crowds, from the demands, from the people. It is hard to live into that command to take time away, even if it is brief, because too often we think we are more important than we really are. The most important thing in our lives is being needed. The most important thing in our lives is being loved by God.

The reality is that not everyone has the luxury of beach vacations or mountain homes. But we all have the gift of being loved by God who cares enough for us that we are invited to get away for a moment and spend time in God's presence. That means spending time in prayer. That means spending time reading scripture. That means spending time in service. That means spending time in worship. It means spending time with other believers.

I hope that you have been able to get away physically to visit loved ones. I pray that you have been able to get away to experience rest and renewal. I pray that you will take every opportunity to "get away," even if it's just for a few moments, to know that you are loved by God. May we all find rest in knowing that we are loved just as we are.


Normal operations for Fayette Samaritans have resumed. The Clothes Closet is now open. Summer clothes and tee shirts of all sizes for men, women and children are needed.


Each camper, and each person for that matter, is inherently gifted by God with a uniqueness and care that comes from the great Creator.
