Life Lessons

In his famous book *Everything I Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten*, Robert Fulgham walks the reader through the simple life lesson and how they expand throughout a person's lifetime. Simple things emerge from the text like kindness in actions. Then there are things of wonder and mystery like growing seeds in a Styrofoam cup. There are important things to take care of oneself like an emphasis on nap time. The premise is a simple one—we have learned what to do and the rules are very simple.

It is very easy to stray from the known things that ground us. After all, these things that we were supposed to have learned in Kindergarten (like kindness and patience, which are also fruits of the Spirit) can sometimes be replaced with things like gossip and using knowledge as power or influence over others as we grow into adults. Thankfully, we do not stop learning. And even more joyously, scriptures give us something after which we can model our lives.

As we begin a new school year, I hope you will join us this Sunday as we take time to fellowship together, worship together, and celebrate communion together. We will also have a time of Blessing of Backpacks for students, teachers, administrators, and all those whose lives are wrapped up in the life and season of school.

Throughout the months of August and September, our worship and sermons will be focused on the life lessons we find in the books of Ephesians and James. I encourage you to read these on your own over the next few months and join us in worship as you are able. As Fayette County schools resume, may we all remember what is foundational for us as people of faith: *"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him (John 3:16-17)."*




GriefShare begins in August



The American Red Cross expresses deep appreciation to Fayetteville First for our consistent blood drives (four times each year).


The FFUMC Blood Drive Team also sends out a huge thanks to all the donors and the faithful volunteers who help make this possible.
