#### Being Right vs. Being Wise

Be careful then how you live, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of the time, because the days are evil. So do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

Ephesians 5:15-17

Usually, I spend a lot of my time reading stories in the Gospels. There, I find not what Jesus is thinking (that is unobtainable for Jesus is God, and I am not). What I do find is what the writers of the Gospels found important to remember about what Jesus said and how Jesus lived. Last week in worship, we read from the book of Ephesians that we are to be imitators of Christ. We are not to think like Jesus: we are to be like Jesus (remember that part about us not being God?)

Lately, in preparation for sermons and for my own personal devotion, I have been reading and studying the Epistles of the New Testament. There we find people trying to get through conflicts in their communities of faith and doing so the best they know how. They do this not by what they think that Christ thought, but by how they remembered Christ lived.

For us as Christians in today's world, there is the temptation to think that if we know what God thinks it will somehow make us better or earn our way into salvation. The Gospels and the Epistles and I would say nearly all of scripture points us to the fact that we don't have to be right about what Christ thinks as long as we surrender our lives to living more like him.

So what is wisdom? If you are wise, does that mean you are always right? If you are right all the time, does that mean that you are wise? I doubt it. At least, I don't think so. I think wisdom comes from a desire to be like Christ. Being like Christ will always be right for Christians, but it may not seem like wisdom for the world.

It seems to me that the human condition is prone to wander (as it says in "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing"). It seems that our desire as flawed humans is to be right. It seems to me that there are people who would rather be right about something than imitators of Christ. It is ok to be right. It is better to be wise. It is best to try to do the impossible—to be like Christ. May we seek to understand the will of the Lord. I invite you to pray this prayer by Reinhold Nieburh.

od grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference, living one day at a time; enjoying one moment at a time; taking this world as it is and not as I would have it; trusting that You will make all things right if I surrender to Your will; so that I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy with You forever in the next. Amen.



### Ready to Sing? Rehearsals begin September 8






### Going beyond the ordinary: The Wesley Challenge Saturdays: September 11 - October 23 10-11 a.m. C-270


