Dear God,

I do not know enough about foreign policy. I do not know enough about viruses, antibodies, and variants. I don't know enough about what it means to serve our country through military service. I do not know what it means to survive an earthquake or live in a country where my economic status and safety can be undone by natural disasters. God there is a lot I do not know in this day and age.

But I foolishly and humbly identify as a Christian. As such, I hopefully and boldly believe you have given us the Word made Flesh. The Word made Flesh which calls us to love our neighbor. And when we get the courage to admit in our own ignorance that we do not know who our neighbor is, we ask you, like the lawyer, "Who is my neighbor?", and you refuse to answer. Instead, the Word gives us a story of one who showed mercy and a follow up command to "go and do likewise."

God of wisdom, I don't understand a lot but I understand this: if I am to be more like you then I am to show mercy. God, I am not praying that you make me an expert on foreign policy or military service so that I can make up my mind about what is happening in Afghanistan. God, I am not praying that you make me an expert on viruses and variants so I can make up my mind about vaccines and masks. God, I am not praying that you make me an expert in tectonic plates and meteorology so I can understand what is happening in Haiti. God save me from speaking as an expert in that which I am not.

God, I do pray that you would make me an expert in your mercy, not only in that I receive it, but that I might be so bold as to give it away out of the abundance of what you give to me. I pray that you would turn my search for understanding of mercy into something that calls me to action, more than a feeling. Help me to be an expert in that which I have received: love, grace, and mercy. This I pray not in the name of wisdom or the quest for knowledge, but in the name of the Word made Flesh, Jesus Christ.


Normal operations for Fayette Samaritans have resumed. The Clothes Closet is now open. Summer clothes and tee shirts of all sizes for men, women and children are needed.

Cutting through the Fog: Information on COVID-19






Going beyond the ordinary: The Wesley Challenge Saturdays: September 11 - October 23 10-11 a.m. C-270

The halls are buzzing with activity, learning and fun as the 2021-2022 preschool year kicked off this week. These smiles are always inspiring!






