Hopeful Decision Making

Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you. Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

— Ephesians 4:31-5:2

There are some days I don't know what I'm doing. I'll be honest. I go about life, making what I think are the best decisions for myself, for my family, for this church, and hopefully, for the Kingdom of God which has no end. This year has amplified that necessity for that word "hopefully." John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Movement, offered three simple rules for living that have been summarized in recent years as 1) Do Good 2) Do No Harm 3) Stay in Love with God. For people of faith, these three things should weigh heavily on us as we make decisions, even when we don't know what we are doing or who is the best person to listen to.

While I don't know the best options moving forward, I cling to those rules of John Wesley in decision making. As CDC guidelines have strongly recommended mask wearing in public settings, so shall we in the coming weeks in church until the time when it is safe to take them off. Wearing masks in worship allows us to gather intergenerationally. The church is one of those places where different generations are together in the same place for a greater purpose. My kids, and others', are not old enough to receive the vaccine. It is important to keep everyone safe, but this allows us the chance to gather together.

I realize this puts us at a crossroads. Our goal is to be of one mind in Christ Jesus. Perhaps the words of Ephesians would do well to guide us in our own attitudes, actions, and hearts in the days ahead. We will be following the CDC recommendation that even fully vaccinated adults and those who are unvaccinated should wear masks in public gathering spaces. Whatever you may or may not feel about that, I pray that you will hear the words from Ephesians as a directive not in what to believe, but in how to be more like Christ. That, after all, is in part what is means to be a Christian.





Children's Ministries Host "Meet The Shepherd Night" August 29 at 4 p.m.






Going beyond the ordinary: The Wesley Challenge Saturdays: September 11 - October 23 10-11 a.m. C-270

Bad Girls of the Bible Wednesdays: September 8 - November 10 12:10 - 12:50 p.m.






