Meaningful Adjacency

Back in May of 2019, I got the opportunity to visit the 9/11 memorial in New York City. While there, I learned a new term—meaningful adjacency. The names at that space are not put on the memorial randomly, or even alphabetically, but next to other people that had connections with that person who also died as a result of the terrorist attacks that day. You have brothers who served as police or firemen in different brigades or divisions placed next to each other. You have friends and relatives and roommates and coworkers represented side-by-side. All were placed there with intention to remind those of us who visit about our interconnectedness.



It is hard these days to have a conversation with anyone about anything without someone thinking it is a political statement or judgment upon a way of thinking. In fact, the more I invite people into meaningful conversation, the more and more I find that we probably disagree. But that's not a bad thing. In fact, it encourages us to find meaning together in shared space—with meaningful adjacency.

In 2019, our son asked what happened on September 11, 2001, to make it a holiday (on the school lunch menu where he chooses whether to buy or take his lunch, it is called Patriot Day and that prompted the question). I fumbled through an answer about evil and fear and the resilience of people. I remembered that as Christians we are not to live in fear but in love. I tried to tell as honestly as I could to a then eight-year old, about the terror and fear I felt that day. In that moment of trying to find words, I remember meaningful adjacency. I was able to speak with certainty about the things in life that matter, the things that keep us together, that unite us, and that hold us even in the midst of terror and fear.

Lives were lost on that day. Families were forever changed. The world view that many of us held was changed in a matter of minutes. Yet we were drawn together. And as our country and our world pieced our stories together, as we struggled to see the light in the midst of darkness, as we emerged from the rubble of tragedy, we found meaningful adjacency in those closest to us in our darkest moments.

My friends, let us be of one mind in Christ Jesus. Let us live lives filled with meaningful adjacency grounded in the love of Jesus Christ. May we live in a way that our adjacency to God and to others, brings us a deeper meaning of this life and of the life to come.








Going beyond the ordinary: The Wesley Challenge Saturdays: September 11 - October 23 10-11 a.m. C-270




