


Tree Cookies, anyone?

Learning from Playground Pumpkins

Fall is one of our favorite times of year on the preschool playground. Cooler temperatures arrive, the children are engaging in deeper play, and we see the return of the pumpkins!

Introducing pumpkins to our outdoor environment provides experiences in many areas of child development. By carrying pumpkins around the playground the children are strengthening their core muscles, shoulders, and wrists which translates to the ability to sit in a chair and write when they are older. Early math skills are supported as children discuss and compare size, weight, and color. Science exploration occurs when the pumpkins encounter gravity, break open and present their gooey insides. And, finally, the pumpkins provide vital opportunities for language growth as the children talk to each other and work cooperatively with the pumpkins. Who knew pumpkins could be so versatile!?

How can you help make our pumpkin experience the best one yet? Grab a pumpkin for us when you pass pumpkin displays at grocery stores and nurseries. All shapes, sizes, and colors are welcome... even ones you may deem too big for preschoolers to handle! We will need a steady supply of them through the months of October and November. Pumpkin donations can be placed on the wood pallet by the playground starting October 1. Thank you for your continued support of our young children!
