#### Welcome, Rev. Joe Watson

Meet our Minister of Nurture, Rev. Joe Watson. Joe has just begun his work with us here at Fayetteville First, but he's been part of the Methodist church his entire life.

Born in Noblesville, Indiana, Joe grew up in the Tampa/St. Petersburg area of Florida and remains a devoted Florida Gator fan. A visit to LaGrange College with a friend landed him in Georgia where he has lived since 1971. After earning a BS Degree in history at LaGrange (and meeting his wife, Julie), he continued his education at Emory University's Candler School of Theology gaining a Master's of Divinity Degree.



Joe married Julie in 1976. Julie taught middle school for 35 years before retiring in 2015. They have two sons, Nathanael Watson, who is an attorney in Atlanta, and Joshua Watson who teaches high school and is the head football coach at Salem High School in Salem, Arkansas. 

Are you ready to gather again on a Wednesday in a relaxed setting? Join our church family for a night of food, fellowship, and celebration!


Who? Everybody!

#### **Piedmont Fayette Support**

#### **UMCOR Giving**

UMCOR provides relief, response, and long-term recovery grants when these events overwhelm a community's ability to recover on their own. UMCOR also provides technical support and training for partners to address emerging and ongoing issues related to disaster relief, recovery, and long-term health and development. #### **Coffee and Conversation Beginning September 12**






#### Going beyond the ordinary: The Wesley Challenge Saturdays: September 11 - October 23 10-11 a.m. C-270


