I often joke that I walk a fine line between being blessed and being spoiled.
I sometimes reflect on the parable of the prodigal son. For me, at least, I walk a fine line between being the (entitled) son who stayed home and the (squandering) son who left home. I imagine that most of us, if we're honest, find ourselves caught between these two extremes. Very rarely do we embody just one character in the story on the extremes. We live our lives somewhere in the middle. How we live in the middle reflects our relationship to God.

This past weekend, we had the opportunity to spend time with Leslie's family. They have a cabin that they rent out through VRBO and we got to stay in it. In it is a guestbook where the visitors can leave recommendations and notes on what they did during their stay. Most people talk about where they are, which hikes and waterfalls they went to, and how relaxing the views are.

In this two bedroom cabin, there are three TVs for entertainment. Rarely do we go to the mountains to watch TV. Apparently, some people don't reflect that same sentiment because three of the last five entries complained that the TVs didn't have full cable service, just select local channels. People were complaining that there weren't enough TV options in the mountains.

Now, there are two ways to see this story: laugh at the complaints of others or contemplate the times when I have "complained about not having enough TV options." There is a lesson here. We may not complain about entertainment choices, but we might complain for other minor inconveniences. I think that comes from a lack of gratitude. One thought we will be considering in the next few weeks at church is "what does it mean to **want** something versus **need** something?" I pray that God's love will be the thing we want and need. From there, may we learn to tell the difference between the wants and needs of the world.

Got Styrofoam? Let Tami on the Green Team know






Church Conference and Charge Conference meetings soon

The concert will be performed on Thursday, December 16 and again on Friday, December 17. Max reservation capacity for each night is 450.



Coordinating community care: Benevolence at work

This past Wednesday the FFUMC Benevolence Team hosted our partners from other churches and agencies in Fayette County for a breakfast and conversation about meeting the need for rent, utility and other forms of assistance from community neighbors experiencing difficult circumstances. Attending were representatives from Fayette Samaritans, St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. Gabriel Catholic Church, St. Vincent de Paul Society of Holy Trinity Catholic Church, Real Life Center and Fayetteville First Baptist Church. Representing FFUMC were Linda Ladd, Jim Haymans, Gaines Wallen, Lea Agnew, Julie Harp and Dian Nelson.

Every group reported experiencing a surge of calls for help to avoid eviction and committed to close cooperation in order to respond effectively. Our church dispersed more assistance in the single month of September than in the first two quarters of the year combined.

You can give Benevolence Funds for our committee to distribute following our guidelines to those seeking assistance. Simply mark "Benevolence" on your check or online donation. Also Benevolence donations may be left on the chancel rail during communion. Generosity to this ministry allows our committee to help those on the margins using donations not included in our regular budget.
