#### What is it that you want me to do for you?

Last Sunday, we read a story about Jesus being asked by James and John to sit at positions of authority. One asked to be on Jesus' right and one asked to be on Jesus' left side. This was in response to Jesus asking, "What is it that you want me to do for you?" Needless to say, it was not the greatest answer that could have been given. Here, the disciples have Jesus offering to give you whatever they want. They asked for future power based upon present assumptions.

It is easy to look at the disciples and laugh at their misunderstanding of Jesus. But how often do we place ourselves in the story as the disciples? How many times do we ask Jesus for future fame or glory or power or wealth based upon present assumptions? How often do we look past the things we have in hopes of something better?

Friends, too often I realize that I am James and I am John. I am not Jesus nor am I the author of Mark who captures these stories. I miss the mark and answer wrongly.

Thank goodness Jesus keeps asking the question of us. Right after Jesus asks James and John "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asks another man the same question. Bartimeus is a blind beggar who has made his way to Jesus through the crowds in search of healing. He came out of his feeling of inadequacy. Yet he already had more than James and John. He knew he wanted Jesus' strength and power now.

How about you? Have you been practicing an attitude of gratitude or have you been anticipating the promises of power? I'll admit, daydreaming about the latter is more fun. Being grateful, however, is a better way. I am grateful for you. I am grateful to be a pastor of this congregation. And I am grateful that we serve a savior who trusts us enough to ask us, "What is it that you want me to do for you?" That is love.




#### October is FFUMC Month at Fayette Samaritans




