Open, Critical Thinking

Do not be conformed to the things of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God--what is good and acceptable and perfect. (Romans 12:2)

One of the more interesting things I have noticed about my time as a student was the rise of critical thinking.

Now before I go any further, please understand that this is not a word on assigning blame or looking to the past or making excuses. This is not a critique of my generation who was taught this. Nor is this a critique of the teachers who were instructed to teach this curriculum. Nor is this a critique of the parents or those on charge at the school board level. I do not share this anecdote to ascribe blame or trespass.

Now, onto that concept of critical thinking. It was helpful in thinking through life, history, the past, and the direction for the future. Critical thinking encourages the student to think through as much as possible and engage thought, emotion, and context. I really do like critical thinking.

On the negative side of critical thinking, the pendulum seems to be resting now in our society with those who are simply critics. We've forgotten the thinking part of it. We've forgotten the growing part of it. We've let those who speak loudest win over our hearts, thoughts, and minds. Our world would rather listen to loud voices who tell only part of the truth, who confirm our biases, and who stroke our egos. The better way is to acknowledge that at times life is complex, there's two sides to every story, and God asks us to be humble. The better way is the harder way.

Yet that is our call. The reality is that critical thinking also means that we have to be open to the reality that we may not be right. We have to be humble enough that we have more to learn. We have to be open to God continuing to reveal God's self to us, even though it doesn't sound or look like we want it to.

May we all be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit moving in and through our hearts and minds.

Flower arranging made simple by Marilyn Harris on October 12



Tree Cookies, anyone?

You may not know the term "tree cookie," but there is a good chance that the young children in your life know what they are. Some may call them tree slices or wood slices, or some other name, but the idea behind them is the same... gross/fine motor strengthening and social play. A tree cookie is quite simply, a slice of a tree. They can be small, like a cookie, or large, like a serving platter!

Children come up with many ways to play with tree cookies. They can be stepping stones, art canvases, or plates. They can help children understand motion, take age-appropriate risks, and learn to cooperate. They make the children feel strong as they tote them around the playground and use them to make towers. They are a wonderful addition to our playground!

Over time the tree cookies dry out and break apart. Sometimes we can use the broken pieces to talk about shapes ("This one broke into triangles like a pizza!) or even fractions ("This one broke into 3 pieces... I'll take a third, you take a third. Who should we give the last third to?")

Tree cookies eventually need to be thrown out. The good news is that they are easily replaced with a little help from mother nature and a chain saw! If you find yourself cleaning up a downed limb or tree, please consider slicing the preschoolers some tree cookies. All sizes are welcome at any time of the year.


