ABOUT COMMUNION

In the United Methodist Church, communion is a sacrament. It is sacred and set apart. A sacrament is a sign, a symbol, and a reminder. It reminds us of God's love. As a symbol, the wafer and the juice we use are things we can see and touch that remind us of something we cannot see and we cannot touch: the grace of God at work in all of our lives.

As we continue worshipping during this Season of the Nativity, we do so by focusing on God's presence in the communion elements, in the people gathered here, and in the fellowship we share at this table. All are welcome at this table because it is God who gives us the invitation.

As you come at the usher's direction, you will be given a wafer to dip into the cup. If you wish to have communion that isn't touched by the ministers or dipped in the shared cup, there are single-serving elements located on the altar. In addition, a gluten-free option is available at the altar.

As you kneel at the altar this morning in body or in spirit, if you would like to leave a donation to our Benevolence Fund here at the church, you are invited to do so by placing your gift on the altar rail.
