The little things Rev. Dr. Thomas Martin

When Jesus came back to visit with his disciples, after his resurrection, after his appearance in the upper room, after his encounter with Thomas, he found them doing the exact thing that they had done before he called them. They were fishing. It does not say whether they were fishing as their occupation, although that is presumed. It could be that they were doing what they knew best. It could also be that they were doing the work they knew how to do and sharing stories because they knew they had other work to do.

When Jesus comes to the shoreline, he doesn't announce himself as their friend Jesus. He doesn't interrupt their work by drawing attention to himself. Instead, he knows they haven't caught any fish, tells them to lower their nets, and with the predictability of the sunrise, their nets are full. Peter, who is now the main character, recognizes Christ and swims to the shore.

What Jesus does next amazes me. Before he asks Peter to feed his sheep and tend his lambs, he cooks him breakfast. Jesus Christ doesn't judge or admonish the disciples. He doesn't tell them how they've messed everything up. He doesn't judge them. He feeds them.

Before Christ ever invites us to follow, he feeds us. It's a little thing, but it makes a big difference. Jesus doesn't offer us discipleship before he offers us food.

What are the little things that you can do?

This Sunday is confirmation Sunday. You, as a church, support this mission through your giving, prayers, and support of this church. Volunteers have given of their time. The students have sacrificed their time to be present in confirmation and committed to learning and growing together.

Here's another little thing: as we share space throughout this exciting renovation, take into account those whose Sunday School classes are meeting in different locations. If you are able on Sunday mornings, park in the church office parking lot or the parking lot closest to the field. This is a little act of kindness, but it frees up space for those with small children or others who may not be used to meeting in a different place.

Whether it's breakfast or it's parking, we know that the little things can make a big difference. Jesus says, "Follow me." That is no little thing, but it makes a big difference.


