A Benevolence Fund Message

Thomas' sermon last week used a well-known Jesus statement to pose a Jesus-like question. "The poor will always be with you – will you always be with the poor?"

Jesus often asked provocative questions, like when the lawyer challenged him to define "who is my neighbor?" Through the Good Samaritan parable, Jesus reframed the question – will you be a neighbor to someone in obvious need?



The generosity of the FFUMC congregation has long enabled our church to be a neighbor to Fayette County residents in difficult circumstances. The statistics are published each week of people served and money disbursed from our Benevolence Fund. Some people need help to get past a temporary bump in the road – and for others, daily life involves ongoing struggle.

The Benevolence Committee stewards the funds placed on the communion rail and otherwise donated for benevolence purposes. We follow guidelines designed to assure responsible and effective use of these gifts.

Through two years of COVID-19 hardship, we have seen both a surge of congregational giving and an even bigger surge of calls for help. Lately the Benevolence Fund has hit a low point, restricting our capacity to respond to neighbors facing eviction, utility cut-off and other crises.

This Sunday, as we share the sacrament of Holy Communion, please remember these neighbors and give as freely as you are able.


Brown Bag with Thomas


Lay Servant Training Offered
