Not expecting the worst but certainly not exactly planning for the best, the preacher came up to the boys and asked, "What exactly is going on here?"

The leader of the group shouted out, "We're going around the circle seeing who can tell the best lie. Whoever tells the best lie gets to keep the puppy."

The preacher was appalled. He had never heard such a thing. He said, "Boys, that has to be one of the worst things that you could do or say. Telling a lie to get a puppy? You should all be ashamed of yourselves. Why, I've never told a lie."

The boys fell silent. Finally, the leader piped up, "Well preacher, looks like you get to keep the puppy."

As Christians, we strive for perfection in love. But we know that we will get it wrong sometimes. That is why God's grace is so important in our lives. We are not perfect. We will get things wrong. We will mess up. Sometimes, churches and congregations will even disagree and fight each other. So how do we respond when we can't seem to get things right?

John's gospel provides us with the secret to living in community. It is also the secret to church growth. It is also the secret to becoming more like Jesus. It's very simple. Love one another.

Jesus says, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this, people will know that you are my disciples." Here is a question to ask yourself at the end of the day, "Is my desire to be right greater than my desire to be loving?" None of us is perfect, no one has all the answers, and occasionally Christians will disagree. But if we truly love others as Christ loved us, then we have nothing to worry about. May our desire to love be greater than our desire to be right.

— Purchase items, place them in a Zip-Loc or other bag, and place bag in the donation bin outside the gym or return to the church office. Include a check for \$5 made payable to the church for each box. Be sure to write "Shoeboxes" on the memo line.
