Generosity and love continue in Edward N. Travis Scholarship

We celebrated all our graduates last Sunday and remember these words from the United Methodist Book of Worship: "We thank you for those who taught and worked beside them, and all who supported them along the way." That support comes not only from those active in the church today, but also from pillars who laid firm foundations here long ago.

One such community pillar was Edward Travis. For 30 years he operated Travis Hardware on the square in downtown Fayetteville. Known throughout the community for his kind and gentle spirit, he took a genuine interest in others, warmly welcoming children visiting the store and lending a helping hand or assistance to those who needed it. The honors Mr. Travis received included being named Fayette County Kiwanis Man of the Year in 1961, Fayette County Citizen of the Year in 1968, and Business Person of the Year in 1982. He received the James E. West Fellowship Award in 1998 by the Kiwanis Club at the 50th celebration of Boy Scout Troop 71, the oldest troop in the county. Mr. Travis was a member of the Fayetteville Masonic Lodge #711 and belonged to the Fayette County Kiwanis for more than 55 years.

A lifelong member of Fayetteville First UMC and part of the Fellowship-Discipleship Class, Mr. Travis loved his community, his church, his family and friends, and certainly the young people of this community and church. In 1991, Ed Travis and his wife, Shelby, started the Edward N. Travis Scholarship Foundation Fund, providing scholarships for further education to seniors at Fayette County High School. In 2007, they turned the foundation funds over to the Board of Trustees of FFUMC to award a scholarship to a senior who is an active member of FFUMC, with the first award presented in 2008.



On behalf of the Travis family, the Board of Trustees, and the entire church family, Kathe Anderson, Trustee Chair, announces that the recipient of the 2022 Edward N. Travis Scholarship is Ellie Kalafut.

Ellie is graduating from Whitewater High School. She and her family have been active at FFUMC since making this their church home when Ellie was in 5th grade. Assuming leadership roles in the youth group and assisting in worship music, she has shared her love for Christ and her passion for ministry. An honors student, Ellie served as class president all four years of high school. In addition, she shared her talent in musical theatre in numerous school productions and was featured in choral presentations. Ellie embarks on her next adventure this fall as she heads to Texas A&M to pursue a major in Industrial Distribution. We extend our prayers and blessings to Ellie.

Ellie shares this message with her church family: "I just want to thank this

church for everything it has done for me. It is an honor to be this year's recipient, especially knowing the hearts of the girls I am graduating with.
