Hearing versus listening Dr. Thomas Martin

"Don't forget your coat." "Don't cross your eyes." "Always wash your hands before you eat." "Look both ways before crossing the street."

There are things we say to our kids (and I remember my parents saying these to me) that we want them to follow and obey. It's not that we are seeking obedience alone. It's that there is something deeper at work. "Don't forget your coat because it's cold out there and we don't want you to get wet or sick." "Don't cross your eyes because they'll get stuck like that" (I actually left my eyes crossed for



too long as a small child and they didn't exactly get stuck permanently, but they did stay in that position for longer than was comfortable). "Always wash your hands before you eat because it helps keep you from getting sick." "Look both ways before crossing the street so you don't get hit or hurt."

Oftentimes, we give instructions without explanation. Sometimes, even Jesus gives us instructions without explanation. "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." Why Jesus? "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all yout might and with all your strength." Why Jesus? "Cast aside your nets and follow me." Why Jesus?

Jesus is good about giving us instructions but not explanations.

Then Jesus says difficult things like, "Those who do not sell all their possessions and give the money away cannot be my disciple." Why Jesus? "Do you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." Why Jesus?

Jesus gives us his words because Jesus is the Word made flesh. He gives us rules but not always explanations. We can hear Jesus, but to listen to him means that we seek a deeper understanding. Just like we hope our kids hear us when we give instructions, we want them to listen so that there is a deeper understanding. I don't think that Jesus is calling us to bring division. I think Jesus is saying that he, himself, will be divisive. When we hear the hard words of Jesus, we must also listen for the Holy Spirit to interpret how we act so we live in a way that not only hears Jesus calling, but listens to the very Word made flesh.
