These boxes were delivered to the North Alabama Disaster Relief Warehouse in Decatur, Alabama, on August 2. Boxes will go through customs in the U.S., then by airplane or boat to Costa Rica, Haiti, Dominican Republic, Nicaragua, or Honduras. They will then go through customs as they arrive in each country. From there they will go by pickup truck, donkey, canoe, whatever they have, to the remote villages. They hope to get them there by Christmas.

The members of the United Women in Faith Marie Lamb Circle plan to sponsor this project again in 2023. Look for details early next year.
