
"What an adventure that guy just had," I thought. "He traveled more miles, more distance, than any other caterpillar. It was a shame to see him meet a demise without living to tell the story."




Clariece Paulk plays this Sunday Save the date for a full concert at FFUMC: November 20

Parent: "Knowing you are thinking of my daughter warms my heart. Sending college boxes is a wonderful reminder of God's love."


Student: "Thank you so much for my package! I have 3 exams this week and this surprise just made my week 100X better. I'm so thankful to be a part of FFUMC."
