Uncertainty

As I write this on Wednesday afternoon, Hurricane Ian is hitting the Florida coast, now registering as an almost Category 5 hurricane. Knowing that this will not be read until Friday reminds me of how little control I have in certain areas of life. None of us can control the weather. Not many of us can understand it. But we can remember it.

There is a lot in life that we cannot control. Medical diagnoses are things we cannot control, but we remember where we were when we heard the news. None of us can control the emotions of others, but we remember how people treat us.

The concepts of "control" and "memory" are two very powerful things in our world. Sometimes, we don't even remember correctly. Then we may really find ourselves out of control.

I am reminded that uncertainty is part of the human equation. It is part of the world in which we live. Perhaps that is why God spoke to Moses to lead the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt. Perhaps it was to remind us that even in chaos, God is in control. It is up to us to remember. Maybe that's why God gives us the words of the prophets. Life got out of control in ancient Israel and the people of God had to remember who they were and whose they were.

When our world seems lost, we remember our savior, Jesus Christ, who offers us grace beyond measure and strength enough for a new day. Jesus does not come into our lives to control us, but so that we might surrender our control to him.

No matter what happens between now and Friday, or Friday and Sunday, we know that we will remember that God calls us to use our memories well. To remember the love that God has given to us so that we might share it with others.

Who knows? In those moments where others grasp for control in their lives, if we show our love through our thoughts, words, and deeds, it just might make the difference for someone to remember God's love in their lives, even when the future is uncertain.

I hope you will join us in person or in spirit this week as we celebrate Holy Communion together and let the certainty of God's love be our focus as we remember God's gift to us.
