Church family,

This has been a difficult week for many in our country due to another major school shooting. This one seems closer to home for some reason. I have written this prayer for myself this week and I humbly share it with you. You may choose to pray this prayer, or not. That is your choice. You may not be able to pray this prayer now or feel like praying this prayer now, and that is ok. There are lots of prayers in the Bible, especially in the Psalms, that I feel uncomfortable praying. That is ok. They are still there because they reflect something in each of us. This is one of those prayers.

Dear God,

I am not an expert in much. I may not even be an expert in anything. My understanding is too shallow for your depths. My own words, too empty for your love. My own emotions, just a hollow shell in the vacuum of what others experience—and even pale in comparison to what Jesus' emotions must have been when he was living on this earth. God, you know that this has been a week of emotions. It has also been a week of experts who think they can fathom such evil as it exists in the world, trying to explain it to us. God save us from the experts.

Save us from the experts who have cornered the market on human suffering and evil. Save us from the experts who ascribe blame and know exactly why a person would enter into a school armed with weapons built to seek, kill, and destroy. Save us from the experts who would seek to justify the behavior and actions rather than change the behavior and actions. Save us from weak resignation.

God, I am not praying to be made an expert.

I don't want to be an expert in weapons or arms or the history of the second amendment. I don't want to be an expert in suffering or the darkness of the human heart. Seeking that knowledge is futile. It would only serve to build up my ego. I cannot fathom the arrogance of someone who is an expert in school shootings. Why would I seek to understand this world when I can barely fathom your love? I don't want to be filled with knowledge; that is too great a thing for me. I pray that I will be filled with love. Love that comes from you, our loving Savior.

We need your help, those of us who are foolish enough to call ourselves and identify as Christians. We need your help to refrain from being experts in pain and sorrow. Children die because of gun violence far too often. Even typing that as a reality does nothing to anesthetize the sting, but this is different for me. When the children dead are my children's age now, I pause and hold on a little tighter to the innocence that they possess. And I pray that you would spare them—and any more children—from reaching the status of being experts in trauma or pain or loss through violence in schools.

So God, I take it back, the part about being an expert. I pray to be made an expert in your love. I pray to be made an expert in your mercy. I pray to be an expert in your justice—and not the worlds' idea of justice for they are not the same thing. I may not know much, but that much I know.

In the midst of heartache, blame, violence, questions, suffering, and experts who claim to know everything, I beg that you would make me and all of us experts in the things that we have received through you: love, grace, and mercy. This I pray, humbly, boldly, and even with sadness and anger in my heart.
